### **Design Review Board**

The Design Review Board advises the Planning Commission and the Department of Planning and Community Development on commercial and mixed-use land use applications, and makes recommendations to the Commission and the City Council on changes, amendments and/or additions to the design guidelines.

Citizens with backgrounds in urban design, public art and property development are encouraged to apply. The board meets regularly during weekday business hours.

### **Utility Advisory Committee**

The Utility Advisory Committee advises the City Council on issues related to the city's storm, water, sewer and other utilities. The committee shall:

- Consult with and make recommendations to the City Council regarding such utility-related matters as the city deems appropriate;
- Give advisory recommendations to the City Council on matters relating to the city's water and sanitary sewer utility policy, and operation; and
- Consult with and make recommendations to the City Council regarding utility rates, rate structures

and other charges made to water and sanitary sewer utility customers.

The committee meets regularly during weekday evening hours.
